- Entries not to be moved from the marguee until 4.00 p.m.
- 11. The Committee reserves the right to inspect the garden of any competitor should the need arise.
- 12. In the event of a tie, where a cup is awarded for the highest number of points in a section, the winner will be decided by the highest number of first prize points. In the event of a further tie a toss of a coin will decide the result.
- 13. The taking of photographs within the show ground is strictly forbidden, except by authorized operators or by individuals for private purposes.



His pride and joy.


Llansadwrn Show was very close to Meirion's heart. For over 30 years he was part of the Show committee and was also Chairman for several years.

Judge's Recipe - Domestic Produce Section Class 56

Ouiche

Pastry 6oz plain flour 3oz chilled butter, cubed

Filling

8oz smoked streaky bacon cut into strips
1 onion, peeled and chopped finely
4oz Gruyère cheese grated
2oz strong cheddar cheese grated
2 large eggs beaten
250ml single cream
Salt & freshly ground black pepper
1 tbsp chopped fresh herbs, such as parsley, thyme.

Method

Preheat the oven to Fan 200C / 425F / Gas 7.

Make the pastry

Put flour into large mixing bowl and add butter. Rub until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add 3 tbsp cold water until pastry comes together in a ball. Refrigerate for 30 minutes.

Roll out the dough on a lightly floured surface and line an 8 inch loose bottomed fluted flan tin. Prick the pastry base all over with a fork. Refrigerate for 15 minutes.

Line the base & sides with baking paper & weigh down with baking beans. Place on baking sheet or tray and bake for 10 minutes.

Remove the beans and grease proof paper and bake the empty pastry case for another 10 minutes, or until lightly golden.

Remove from oven and trim overhanging pastry.

Reduce the oven temperature to Fan 160C / 350F / Gas 4.

Meanwhile cook the onion and bacon slowly in a sauté pan for 10 minutes or so until onions are golden and bacon slightly crisp.

Add them evenly to the bottom of the pastry case. Top with the cheese.

In a bowl, mix the eggs, cream, salt, pepper, herbs. Then pour into the quiche, being careful to not overfill the case. A few halved cherry tomatoes may be added to the top if desired.

Bake for 25-30 minutes until golden and just set.

Delicious eaten warm or cold.
