RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All exhibitors, riders & trade stands must have their own Public Liability Insurance.
- 2. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss of property, accident to persons or damage to the exhibits on the Show premises.
- Exhibits in all sections to be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor for one month prior to the Show. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 4. Any objections to be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary within 20 minutes after judging has ended in that class, with a deposit of £5. The Show Officials decision thereon will be final and, if the objection is not upheld, the deposit will be forfeited.
 The Committee reserves the right to have any horse measured.
- All exhibits to be on Show Field not later than 30 minutes before judging of their class.
- All animals to be led and no animals shall be allowed in the show ground unless properly haltered.
- All Livestock Vehicles will be admitted to the field free of charge including the driver.
- 8. All Horses to remain in designated areas unless competing in Show Ring.
- 9. Sheep to be entered before unloading.
- 10. Entries not to be moved from the marquee until 4.00 p.m.
- 11. The Committee reserves the right to inspect the garden of any competitor should the need arise.
- 12. In the event of a tie, where a cup is awarded for the highest number of points in a section, the winner will be decided by the highest number of first prize points.

 In the event of a further tie a toss of a coin will decide the result.
- 13. The taking of photographs within the show ground is strictly forbidden, except by authorized operators or by individuals for private purposes.
- 14. DEFRA rules are to be observed.
- 15. No bicycles allowed on the Show Field.

Born in the Vale of Glamorgan, I moved to Salem at 4 years of age and attended school in Llandeilo. I met John at The Young Farmers Club and we got married at Manordeilo Church in 1965. We have been farming at Closglas for the last 59 years which has been so rewarding in spite of it's many ups and downs. I also had many a happy day working for Nigel and Rita Williams at the chemist in Llandeilo.

John:

I have family connections with Llansadwrn, my Mother was brought up at Cefnparc. My Grandfather was the treasurer of the village community group raising funds for the war effort. The money raised was loaned to the government and when it was paid back he organised it to be used for the play area in Llansadwrn.

I was born at Tirmynydd, Salem and moved to Coed Mawr in 1943. I was a pupil at Cwmifor School, then Llandovery College, where rugby was much more of an attraction than my studies. As well as the farm, the Hwyrnos at Plas Glansevin provided many happy memories. When the herd was dispersed in 2001, along came Agri Lloyd.

My Mother thought fondly of Llansadwrn and I am honoured to support the Show.







Judge's Recipe Domestic Produce Section, Class 56 Toffee and Almond Shortbread

Ingredients

For the Base For the Topping.

A square or round tin.

100 g / 4 oz unsalted butter.

200 g / 7 oz flaked almonds.

Pinch of salt.

3 tablespoons caster sugar.

2 tablespoons honey.

125 g / 4.5 oz unsalted chilled, diced butter.

3 tablespoons single or whipping cream.

1 large egg yolk. lcing sugar (optional to decorate).

Method

Base

Preheat the oven to 190c/375f/gas 5.

- 1. Sift flour, salt & sugar into mixing bowl. Add the butter & rub in with your fingertips until the mixture resembles fine crumbs. Add the egg yolk & gently knead the mixture to make a dough.
- 2. Crumble the dough into the tin & spread evenly, then flour your fingers and gently press mixture onto the base of the tin & smooth to an even layer. Prick with a fork and chill for 15 mins.
- 3. Bake the shortbread base for 10 -12 minutes until light golden brown. Remove from oven.

Topping

- 1. Melt butter in a pan, add the almonds, sugar & honey & cook over a low heat stirring gently until bubbling & straw coloured. Stir in the cream. Bring back to simmer & cook for just 1 min. Pour the mixture over the base & spread evenly (Take care as it will be very hot).
- 2. Return to the oven, bake for 10 -12 mins until the topping has turned a glossy golden brown.
- 3. Transfer the tin to a wire rack & leave until completely cold & set (preferably overnight) before cutting into squares or diamonds or any other shape. Decorate with icing sugar or something of your choice or leave plain.
- 4. Display 4 slices.
